**What if I don't have a valid email account?**

An email account is required for information to be sent, but the accuracy of the email account is not verified by the system. Those who do not have an active email account, a false email account will be assigned to you so the system will work.

Having a valid email account helps by letting you know a message has been sent and what that message said, if your getting emails, but no phone calls you need to let us know.

**What is sms, and what does it mean to me?**

**SMS** is short for simplified message system, or a text message that most cellular phones can receive. If your not certain if your phone gets text messages, it is best to receive the voice message by **not** circling the *sms* option. SMS message are also limited to 145 letters so these warnings will be extremely short and may not explain the full extent of the current situation. Just a heads up that something is going on.

**Why do I have 3 different phone options?**

The alert system is broken down by color categories based on the threat level of the incident. A Red (Severe) threat is the highest threat followed by Orange (High), Yellow (Elevated), Blue (Guarded) and Green (Low), In the model we have set as default phone 1 will receive alerts on all condition levels. While Phone 2 and 3 will only receive messages on Red thru Yellow alerts.

These levels can be changed per your request. But if you wish only to get the most severe warnings only leave your number on Phone 2 or Phone 3. Yellow alerts will be notices of significance, weather alerts for severe conditions. Yellow alerts may also be used to notify parents if bus from a sporting event are running late or other such information. Blue and Green alerts will be used as reminders for meetings or even sports scores while our teams are away.

**Why is this asking about my or my childrens activities?**

The ability to send a specific message to members of the community that have signed up will help keep us organized and informed. The idea behind this system is to generate one accurate message that can be sent out to explain a situation and be delivered almost immediately to everyone involved. For example, if the High School Football teams bus is running late back to town a message can be sent to the parents of the players letting them know what is going on, how late they expect the bus to be and if they see anything else that may delay the bus longer.

Different groups within the community will have access to this system, it will be up to the citizens to acknowledge that they belong to various groups so they can receive the messages they want.

As your groups begin to use this system they should let you know about it and ask you to sign up or make a list saying you would like to receive their notices.

The ADT Immediate Response Information System was originally bought for emergencies and severe weather notification. Its ability to reach so many so quickly makes it a great resource for the community. Once organized correctly this system should prove a great tool at getting information to those who want it. While maintaining its posture in the event of an emergency.
